WHEREAS, December 7, 2014 marks the 73rd anniversary of a day that will live in infamy, the attack upon Pearl Harbor by the Empire of Japan; and

WHEREAS, The people of Kentucky honor the memory of those members of our Armed Forces who lost their lives in the attack and appreciate those who survived and courageously continued to serve, ultimately achieving total victory; and

WHEREAS, On every December 7 we recognize the bravery and honorable service of the thousands of Kentuckians who were called to serve in our Armed Forces as a result of that infamous day;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, STEVEN L. BESHEAR, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do hereby proclaim December 7, 2014, as

PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY

in Kentucky.
