PTSD Coach Online

The expanded desktop version of the mobile app, gives you 17 tools to choose from to help you manage stress. Learn to manage troubling symptoms following trauma, such as, sleep, trauma reminders and anger. <u>Mobile app</u> also available.

<u>CRAFT-PTSD - Help with PTSD for You and Your Family.</u>
 Community Reinforcement and Family Training - Posttraumatic Stress Disorder (CRAFT-PTSD) is a self-paced online course for family members of someone working to manage PTSD. Learn skills to encourage and support your loved one and find resources to support your own quality of life.

These free online programs are available on the Veteran Training website. Some trainings have a related mobile app for additional support.

· Anger and Irritability Management Skills

This course offers a wide range of practical skills and tools to manage your anger and develop self-control over your thoughts and actions.

This course teaches skills to help you overcome stressful problems and meet your goals in managing stress, balancing school and family, relationships, coping with physical injuries, financial difficulties, and adjustment issues.

• Path to Better Sleep

This course provides information and practical tools to manage sleep problems.

Parenting Course

This course provides parents with tools that strengthen parenting skills and helps them reconnect with their children, and deal with both everyday problems and family issues that are unique to the military lifestyle.



Shane LaGrone: KY Vet Cemetery Central Gets New Director

After 30 years of serving in the military, Retired Command Chief Master Sergeant Shane LaGrone has committed himself to serving the Commonwealth of Kentucky as the new Director of Kentucky Veteran Cemetery Central.

He served 16 years Active Duty in the U.S. Air Force, 14 years active in the Kentucky Air National Guard and retired in May 2022.

"I've been to several military funerals. I've been in the military, you know, known people who were Killed in Action in country," LaGrone said. "So going to those [funerals], always had a little special place in my heart. Just the meaning behind it. It was always just amazingly professional, and it was hard to keep the eyes dry sometimes."

While in the military LaGrone served as an Explosive Ordnance Disposal technician. Part of such a profession required him to deploy often and he expressed some of his favorite memories are of coming home from those deployments.

"Everybody's going 90 miles an hour, you know, you're on one day off the next, you're running calls left and right," LaGrone said. "You have your downtime, but you're still not really down until you finally get on that plane and then just all of a sudden, all the emotions and the weight of the past six, seven or eight months hits you. Alright, let's shake that off. Everybody started sharing stories. Those are some of the best moments. I would say all those plane rides home or even when you're in between plane rides and you're in the airport bar having that first beer after six months of not drinking, you know."

LaGrone explained how EOD is a very small career field, the difficult/morbid cases which come with the job, and how this impacted him and his peers.

"Sharing stories, you'll cry, and everybody cries a little bit," LaGrone said. "Everybody's, 'hey, we miss so and so.' [We talk about] Whoever got a blown up that day or that tour. We were losing, in the height of it, six to ten [EOD friends and peers] a year. We're such small community we all knew somebody, or knew them through someone else, someone that we lost. It was our chance to unwind and let it out to share the good things we remembered about those guys."



The transition from

military to retiring and what to do next, LaGrone wanted something service oriented. Being no stranger to leadership as a former Chief he found the opening for the Director position for Kentucky Veteran Cemetery Central.

"I didn't need to work, but I wanted to," LaGrone said. "I wanted to do something I enjoyed and that was meaningful. Every day there's something new here whether it be I met somebody new that's got a different story, or whether we're facing a new problem to solve

for the cemetery. Figuring these things out to provide the best to our veterans."

Finally, his ultimate and ambitious goal for the cemetery going forward:

"I would love to see Kentucky Veteran Cemetery Central become Kentucky's version of Arlington Cemetery," LaGrone said.

Thank you for your service. This is a summary of Kentucky's State Veteran Benefits: Kentucky allows a military retiree to exclude military retired pay income of up to \$31,110 from adjusted gross income when filing state income tax returns.

The only adjustment to property taxes is for veterans who are 100% disabled. Application for the disability exemption is made through the county property valuation office. The value of the homestead exemption for the 2023-2024 assessment years is \$46,350.

Making a Difference Through the PACT Act

In 2019, an Army reservist who deployed to Kuwait during Operation Iraqi Freedom went to urgent care for shortness of breath and a cough and was diagnosed with lung cancer. Years later, after hearing about President Biden's new toxic exposure law, she submitted her first claim ever with VA. Because of the new law, her lung cancer was presumed to be caused by her service, so her claim was granted, and she received benefits backdated to August 10, 2022, the day that the bill became law. This Veteran's condition has since improved, and she is thankful and relieved that her future health care will be covered by VA.



BE VIGILANT OF PACT ACT SCAMS

On August 10, President Biden <u>signed the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson</u>
<u>Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act (PACT Act) into law</u>. This law helps millions of Veterans and their survivors by:

- Extending VA health care eligibility for Veterans with toxic exposures and Veterans of the Vietnam, Gulf War, and Post-9/11 (Post-September 11, 2001) eras
- Expanding benefits eligibility for Veterans exposed to toxic substances and their survivors





Tips to Avoid PACT Act Scams

Scammers are taking advantage of new opportunities to commit fraud. There's been an increase in PACT Act-related phone, and social media scams targeting Veterans to access their PACT Act benefits or submit claims on their behalf.

Veterans should be cautious of anyone who guarantees a lucrative financial benefit or service.

Do's

- You may submit your application securely <u>online</u> via VA.GOV or in person at any Regional Office. You may file your daim directly with VA and then, VA will assist in gathering evidence necessary to support it. There are no costs or hidden fees to apply.
- Be cautious of companies who advertise VA benefits can only be obtained with their help. These companies may not be recognized by VA and may be attempting to charge illegal fees.
- Be cautious of aggressive companies who may try to pressure you to sign their contract through frequent communications or by insisting "you must act now or lose your chance for benefits."
- Be cautious of companies who claim to be contacting you on behalf of VA or to have a special relationship with VA. Contact VA at 1-800-827-1000 if you are unsure about the authenticity of any message received.
- Validate: If you are interested in working with a Veteran Service Organization (VSO), agent, or attorney, use the Office of General Counsel <u>Accreditation tool</u> to confirm and validate their credentials.

Don'ts

- Do not sign a contract agreeing to pay an unauthorized company a percentage of your benefit payment in exchange for their assistance with your VA claim. If you need help filling a claim, there are representatives of VSOs, agents, and attorneys who have been accredited by VA to assist you.
- Do not sign a blank form for someone else to complete later Always review the completed form before signing and keep a copy for yourself.
- On not be fooled by companies who advertise they have special relationships with medical professionals and can guarantee your benefits award. If they are defrauding the Federal government, you could be held responsible for paying those benefits back.
- Do not provide your social security number, medical records, or other personally identifiable information to anyone offering daims assistance before confirming their credentials using the Office of General Counsel Accreditation tool.
- Do not sign forms that are not <u>VA generated</u> or third-party authorization for someone to provide "behind-the-scenes" daims assistance.
