Latest VA News

VA announces steps to increase life-saving screening, access to benefits for Veterans with cancer

As a part of the Biden Cancer Moonshot, VA announced several critical new steps to expand preventive services, health care, and benefits for Veterans with cancer:

- 1. VA is making urethral cancers presumptive for service connection for eligible Gulf War and post-9/11 Veterans. This means that Gulf War and post-9/11 Veterans who deployed to Iraq, Afghanistan, Somalia, Djibouti, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Yemen, Uzbekistan, and the entire <u>Southwest Asia theater of</u> <u>operations</u> will not need to prove that their service caused their urethral cancer to receive benefits for it; instead, VA will automatically assume service connection for the disease and provide benefits accordingly to Veterans who have submitted claims. In the next 90 days, urethral cancers will be added to the list of 300+ conditions considered presumptive under the PACT Act, along with <u>many other</u> <u>cancers</u>.
- 2. VA is beginning the process to formally evaluate urinary bladder and ureteral cancers for presumptions of service connection for eligible Gulf War and post-9/11 Veterans. Over the coming months, VA will evaluate whether there is a relationship between urinary bladder and ureteral cancers and toxic exposures for Gulf War and post-9/11 Veterans who deployed to Iraq, Afghanistan, Somalia, Djibouti, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Yemen, Uzbekistan, and the entire <u>Southwest Asia theater of operations</u>. VA will then determine whether these conditions become presumptive conditions for Veterans who served in those locations and time periods.
- 3. VA is expanding access to genetic, lung, and colorectal cancer screening for Veterans. By the end of this year, VA will offer genetic testing to every Veteran who may need it, which will help VA understand, treat, and ultimately cure some patients with cancer by reading the code locked in their DNA. VA will also bring a lung cancer screening program to every VA medical facility, which will help save the lives of the nearly 5,000 Veterans who die from lung cancer every year, and VA will expand screening for colorectal cancer – the second leading cause of cancer death

in America – by providing more than 1 million Veterans nationwide with convenient, safe, and effective tests that can be completed in the comfort of their homes.

4. VA continues to expand the reach of smoking cessation services to Veterans across the nation. As the 1-855-QUIT-VET tobacco quitline and the SmokefreeVET text message program pass their 10-year anniversaries of service, VA will add at least six additional sites to the Quit VET eReferral program by the end of 2024. This will expand capacity to offer Veteran-specific, tailored tobaccouse treatment to Veterans. Additionally, VA recently launched a new pilot program to integrate smoking cessation services into lung cancer screening in recognition of the inherent connection between smoking and lung cancer risk - and VA plans to add at least five additional sites between 2024-2025. These programs have supported tens of thousands of Veterans with high-quality tobacco cessation resources in English and Spanish: Quit VET has provided over 62,000 calls to Veterans, and more than 48,000 Veterans have made a guit attempt with the SmokefreeVET text program. In 2023, more than 5,100 Veterans enrolled in the SmokefreeVET text program and Quit VET recorded its highest volume of incoming calls yet, with counselors answering 23% more calls than the prior year. Direct referrals from VA facilities grew 34% over the same time period and by the end of 2023, 40 VA programs were implementing a patient referral program.

This work is a part of fulfilling President Biden's Unity Agenda and <u>Cancer Moonshot</u> and VA's aggressive efforts to provide world-class care for over one million Veterans on the cancer care continuum, from screening to survivorship.

"Cancer impacts far too many Veterans every year, and under President Biden's leadership of the Cancer Moonshot, we are fighting to end cancer as we know it," **said VA Secretary Denis McDonough.** "These steps will help us save lives and provide the worldclass care and benefits that Veterans with cancer so rightly deserve."

"VA is planting the seeds for the future of cancer care," **said VA Under Secretary for Health Shereef Elnahal, M.D.** "By investing in screenings, expanding access, and embracing cutting-edge technologies, VA is revolutionizing cancer care delivery, providing the best care possible to our nation's heroes."

This effort builds on VA and the Biden-Harris Administration's comprehensive efforts to care for Veterans with cancer. Last July, VA <u>expanded cancer risk assessments and mammograms (as clinically appropriate)</u> to Veterans under 40, regardless of age, symptoms, family history, or whether they are enrolled in VA health care. Last September, VA and the National Cancer Institute announced a historic data-sharing collaboration to better understand and treat cancer among Veterans. VA has also <u>prioritized claims</u> <u>processing</u> for Veterans with cancer — delivering <u>nearly \$516 million</u> in PACT Act benefits to Veterans with cancer between August 10, 2022 and March 3, 2024. And VA has <u>screened more than 5 million</u> Veterans for toxic exposures under the PACT Act — a critical step to detecting, understanding, and treating potentially life-threatening health conditions like cancer.

Moving forward, through advancements in cancer care and forward-thinking research endeavors, VA aims to save even more lives and significantly improve the long-term health outcomes in Veterans for generations to come. For more information about VA cancer care, visit <u>cancer.va.gov</u>.

VA launches new financial resource website to help promote financial wellness and prevent Veteran suicide

The Department of Veterans Affairs announced a <u>new website</u> to help Veterans manage financial stressors that can affect their mental health and wellbeing. Developed by the National Veterans Financial Resource Center (FINVET), the website aims to boost protective factors that promote mental health and reduce suicide risk by helping Veterans learn about and manage their finances.

Economic and financial uncertainty can increase the risk of suicide. FINVET helps mitigate that risk by connecting Veterans to trustworthy financial tools, information, videos, calculators, and worksheets – serving as a one-stop website for Veterans to learn a variety of essential information to help meet their financial goals. Using simple navigation, FINVET empowers Veterans to learn about financial goals such as meeting basic needs, saving or earning more money, lowering bills and debt, and protecting their assets. The website pulls together resources from across more than 25 government agencies, including the Department of Labor, Federal Trade Commission, National Park Service, and the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Ending Veteran suicide is <u>VA's top clinical priority</u> and a key part of President Biden's <u>Unity</u> <u>Agenda</u>. Moving forward, VA and the <u>Biden-Harris Administration</u> will continue to work urgently to reduce Veteran suicide through a <u>public health approach</u> that combines both community-based and clinically based strategies to save lives.

"We know that financial issues are linked to increased suicide risk in Veterans, as well as increased risk of homelessness," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "With this new website, our mission is to empower every Veteran to take advantage of financial tools and resources so they can earn more, save more, and avoid financial distress that can lead to suicidal ideation."

In recent years, VA has worked aggressively to expand support for Veterans in crisis, including <u>beginning to offer no-cost emergency suicide prevention care</u> for eligible Veterans and certain former service members, <u>launching the 988 (then press 1)</u> to help Veterans connect more quickly with caring, qualified responders through the Veterans Crisis Line; <u>collaborating with community-based suicide prevention organizations</u> to

provide Veterans with on-the-ground support; expanding <u>firearm suicide prevention efforts;</u> and encouraging Veterans to reach out for help through a <u>national Veteran</u> <u>suicide prevention awareness campaign.</u>

The National Veterans Financial Resource Center was created by VA's Office of Suicide Prevention in alignment with the <u>National Strategy for Preventing Veteran Suicide</u> and the <u>President's National Strategy for Reducing Military and Veteran Suicide</u>. What's New at KDVA?

3rd Quarter Veterans Program Trust Fund Results



On March 20, 2024, the VPTF awarded over \$392K in grants to nine organizations. The largest quarterly by the fund in recent years.

The Veterans Program Trust Fund with KDVA provides funds to veteran programs and initiatives across the Commonwealth of Kentucky that are unable to get funds elsewhere.

The trust fund is overseen by a Board of Directors I've appointed and receives its funds through the Veteran License Plate purchases and renewals.

Following March 20th's Trust Fund Meeting, the Boards approved and awarded...

- A grant in the amount of \$105,000 was awarded to the Honor Flight Bluegrass which provides flights for veterans to visit their War Memorials built in their honor in Washington D.C.
- The Clark County Veterans Council, Inc. was awarded \$100,000 to build a public monument to honor the sacrifices of 101 Clark County residents who gave their lives in World War II and Korea.
- Honor Flight Kentucky Inc. was awarded \$75,000 to fly KY Veterans to Washington D.C. to tour war memorials and lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.
- Lady Veterans Connect was awarded \$14, 746 to host a weekend retreat for Kentucky women veterans at Cumberland Falls State Park.

- Louisville Armed Forces Committee was awarded \$5,000 to recognize and honor KY veterans at the Louisville Armed Forces Day Dinner, May 17, 2024.
- Rowan County Veterans Foundation was awarded \$500 to build a simulated "hooch" in the Rowan County Veteran Museum on the north wall of the Vietnam room and display memorabilia from the Civil War to present Wars.
- The Kentucky Veterans Hall of Fame was awarded \$30,000 to recognize and honor KY veterans in the KY Veterans Hall of Fame.
- Operation Odyssey Outdoors was awarded \$10,000 to sponsor a trip to Florida for 20 wounded heroes. Operation Odyssey Outdoors is a non-profit entity that exists to serve Kentucky's current or former members of the United States Armed Forces.
- Kentucky Department of Veterans Affairs Homeless Veterans Program was awarded \$50,000 to prevent eviction and utility disconnection for veterans and their families.

The total funds granted: \$392,746.

In the past several years the Kentucky Veterans Program Trust Fund in support of Kentucky Habitat for Humanity has sponsored multiple home builds for veterans.


GAB visits Willet Distillery

Who is eligible

Any owner of a noncommercial motor vehicle required to be registered for use on Kentucky Highways.

Steps Requirement

Application must be made at your local County Clerk's office. Upon receipt of this plate, your regular (special) issue license plate must be turned in or issued to another vehicle.

Decal Expires Customer's Birth Month

\$10.00 of the initial and \$5.00 of the renewal registration fee goes to the Kentucky Department of Veterans' Affairs. For more information, please visit <u>http://veterans.ky.gov</u>. This plate is available for personalization with an additional \$25.00 fee annually. Personalization is limited to a maximum of 5 characters.
