Walk to END EPILEPSY® Initiative Returns to Kentucky this Summer Join with Others in Person or Walk Your Way to Make a Difference

The Epilepsy Foundation of Kentuckiana (EF Kentuckiana) is once again gearing up for its 2024 Walk to END EPILEPSY® initiative throughout June. This initiative offers in-person events and a Walk Your Way Challenge to raise \$126,000 to benefit the more than 173,000 children, adults, and veterans living with epilepsy and their families throughout Kentucky and southern Indiana. The Epilepsy Foundation's Walk to END EPILEPSY® series is a platform to create awareness, share stories, help educate others, and raise funds to support people living with epilepsy.

"This year's Walk to END EPILEPSY® is back, and it's better than ever," said Gary Zortman, events manager, EF Kentuckiana. "We are offering different ways that people can participate in their community. We invite everyone to join with friends, family, and colleagues to celebrate one another in person at one of our four local events or opt to make the walk on their own, wherever they live. No matter where people are, each step and fundraising dollar counts."

Epilepsy can affect anyone. Over a lifetime, one in 10 people will have a seizure, and one in 26 will be diagnosed with epilepsy. Despite its prevalence, epilepsy receives 10 times less funding than other brain disorders.

This June, four in-person Walk events will take place at different locations throughout Kentucky. Walkers are encouraged to go to <u>www.efky.org/walk</u> to register themselves, create their own personal Walk page, and recruit family and friends to register along with them as part of their Walk team. Walkers, no matter in person or Walk Your Way, can earn some great incentive prizes and help the EF Kentuckiana accomplish its goal of raising \$126,000, for the one in 26 diagnosed with epilepsy. Check-in for those attending the inperson Walks will be from 9-10am, with each walk beginning at 10:15 and concluding at noon at the following locations:

Louisville – Slugger Field on June 1 Lexington – Kentucky Horse Park on June 8 Paducah – Noble Park on June 15 Owensboro – Legion Park on June 22

For those who are not able to walk in person, we encourage them to register and recruit their family and friends to participate to complete the Walk by hitting the streets, trails, and treadmills. It doesn't matter whether they stroll, saunter, or power-walk, they can complete their Walk whenever and wherever, while others in their community do the same. No matter how people choose to participate, everyone's support will help raise epilepsy awareness and much needed funds for the EF Kentuckiana's mission.

About Epilepsy

According to the <u>World Health Organization</u>, epilepsy is the most common serious brain disorder worldwide with no age, racial, social class, national or geographic boundaries. The <u>U.S. Centers for Disease Control & Prevention</u> (CDC) estimates that 3.4 million people in the United States are affected by epilepsy. It is the underlying tendency of the brain to produce seizures which are sudden abnormal bursts of electrical energy that disrupt brain functions.

About the Epilepsy Foundation of Kentuckiana (EF Kentuckiana)

Was developed in 1993 by several moms whose daughters were diagnosed with epilepsy. The EF Kentuckiana operates as an independent affiliate of the national Epilepsy Foundation, to lead the fight to overcome the challenges of living with epilepsy. The Foundation connects people to treatment, support, and resources; leads local, state, and national advocacy efforts; funds innovative research and the training of specialists; and educates the public about epilepsy and seizure first aid. by a grassroots movement and has shone a light on epilepsy to promote awareness and understanding, and to advocate for laws that matter to people with epilepsy, while also funding epilepsy research. In partnership with the CDC, the Epilepsy Foundation has helped to improve access to care for people with epilepsy, expanded its digital reach and online resources in homes across the country, and trained more than 600,000 people in seizure recognition and first aid. The Epilepsy Foundation continues to focus on serving the epilepsy community through advocacy, education, direct services, and research for new therapies. VA housed nearly 48,000 Veterans experiencing homelessness in fiscal year 2024

These final FY 2024 numbers surpass VA's goal by over 16%, marking the largest number of Veterans housed in a single year since FY 2019

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs announced it housed 47,925 Veterans experiencing homelessness in FY 2024, surpassing <u>its goal to house 41,000 Veterans</u> by 16.9% and marking the largest number of Veterans housed in a single year since FY 2019. VA also ensured that 96% of the Veterans housed during this time did not return to homelessness. This follows last month's announcement that VA had <u>surpassed its FY</u> 2024 housing goal a month early.

Ending Veteran homelessness is a top priority for VA and the entire Biden-Harris Administration. Since FY 2022, VA has permanently housed nearly 134,000 homeless Veterans, and the total number of Veterans experiencing homelessness in the U.S. has fallen by over 4% since early 2020 and by more than 52% since 2010.

"Nearly 48,000 formerly homeless Veterans now have a safe, stable place to call home — and there's nothing more important than that," said **VA Secretary Denis McDonough.** "No Veteran should experience homelessness in this nation they swore to defend. We are making real progress in this fight, and we will not rest until Veteran homelessness is a thing of the past."

VA has also made progress in combating Veteran homelessness in the Greater Los Angeles area, permanently housing 1,854 homeless Veterans this fiscal year — the most of any city in America (for the third year in a row) and exceeding VA's <u>FY 2024 goals</u> for this region by 15.5%. Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority's recent <u>Point-in Time</u> <u>count</u> revealed a 22.9% reduction in Veterans experiencing homelessness in Los Angeles between 2023 and 2024.

VA's efforts to combat Veteran homelessness are grounded in reaching out to homeless Veterans, understanding their unique needs, and addressing them. These efforts are built

on the evidence-based <u>"Housing First" approach</u>, which prioritizes getting a Veteran into housing, then providing or connecting them with the wraparound services and supports they need to stay housed, including health care, job training, legal and education assistance, and more.



I Support Veterans License Plates



Who is eligible

Any owner of a noncommercial motor vehicle required to be registered for use on Kentucky Highways.

Steps Requirement

Application must be made at your local County Clerk's office. Upon receipt of this plate, your regular (special) issue license plate must be turned in or issued to another vehicle.

Decal Expires Customer's Birth Month

\$10.00 of the initial and \$5.00 of the renewal registration fee goes to the Kentucky Department of Veterans' Affairs. For more information, please visit <u>http://veterans.ky.gov</u>. This plate is available for personalization with an additional \$25.00 fee annually. Personalization is limited to a maximum of 5 characters.


