Latest VA News

VA increases in-home and community-based services expenditure cap for Veterans with complex conditions

The Department of Veterans Affairs announced an increase in the expenditure cap for [in-home and community-based services](#) for Veterans with certain complex medical conditions.

VA's [skilled home health care program](#) will now cover the costs of in-home and community-based services for Veterans with spinal cord injuries, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis, and other complex medical conditions at 100% of the cost of similar care in a [VA Community Living Center](#). This is an increase from the previous rate of 65%.

The rate increase will significantly reduce out-of-pocket costs for eligible Veterans and their families for services like home health aide, home respite, community adult day health care, Veteran Directed Care, and skilled home health. This will make it easier for Veterans to continue residing in their homes.

VA estimates 200 Veterans will take advantage of the higher expenditure cap in fiscal year 2026. The skilled home health care program has enrolled approximately 1,800 Veterans since it was established in 2019.

“This important change will enable Veterans with complex medical conditions to continue receiving high quality care while remaining in their homes, surrounded by friends and family,” said **VA Secretary Doug Collins**. “By matching the expenditure cap for home and community-based services with the cost of care in our Community Living Centers, we are enabling Veterans to maintain their independence and home connections.”

The rate increase is the result of [Section 120 of the Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act of 2025](#). VA encourages Veterans and their families to speak with their VA social worker to learn more about these changes.

KYNECT-A-VET

What is KYNECT-A-VET?

If you are a Kentucky veteran aged 60 or older OR a veteran of any age with a traumatic brain injury as defined by KRS 211.470, you may qualify to receive a Samsung mobile device that is preloaded with the "Here Now Help" app to increase veteran access to resources and supports.

This pilot program is a partnership with the KY Department of Veteran Affairs and the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, Department for Aging and Independent Living.

How do I apply?

Kentucky agencies serving veterans may complete an application to nominate a veteran who meets the eligibility criteria.

How can I obtain an application?

The application is located on the KDVA website at:

kynectavet@ky.gov

An announcement will be sent to agencies serving veterans. All completed applications will be sent to a secured KDVA email box.

What is the deadline to submit an application?

Applications can be submitted starting now through midnight EST **September 30, 2022**. Applications must be fully completed and submitted by the due date to be considered. Selected nominees will be notified no later than July 31, 2025.

KDVA recognizes the distinguished services of KDVA Office of Kentucky Veterans Centers (OKVC) Executive Director Mark Bowman and Deputy Martha Workman as they retire from state government service.

Over the past 12 years, Director Bowman and Deputy Director Workman worked tirelessly to make OKVC one of top state veteran center organizations in the nation. Specialized Staff

Some veterans face significant barriers that make it difficult for them to find suitable employment, especially vets who are transitioning into civilian life. Most offices have specialized staff—all of whom are veterans—who work closely with employers to create more opportunities for veterans and provide the following services to veterans themselves:

- Help developing an employability plan and goals
- Coaching in individual and group settings
- Referrals to supportive services, including vocational rehabilitation, transportation, elder care, food and nutrition services, and non-profit organizations that address homelessness

Priority of Service for Veterans

U.S. military veterans and other covered persons receive Priority of Service (POS) in all employment, training, and placement services in any workforce preparation program funded by the U.S. Department of Labor.

Veterans receive access to services or resources provided sooner than others.


Covered persons include the spouse of a veteran who died of a service-connected disability, has a total service-connected disability, is missing in action, or is a prisoner of war.

- What lessons did your service teach you that you still carry with you?
- What does your service mean to you?

These questions are great when speaking to a family member about someone who served in the military.

- In which branches of the military have our family members served?

- How did your life change when your family member entered the service?
- Do you have advice for other military family members?
- Is there anything you wish service members and civilians understood about being the family member of a service member?
- Do you remember your favorite place you lived? What was special about it?
- How did being a military child shape your life?
- Can you tell me about a person that you felt understood by as the child of a service member?

A training program for beginning and prospective farmers!

Focus on military veterans and small scale farms



Farm business planning, book keeping, and farm tax preparation

APPRENTICESHIP TOPICS

"ARMED TO FARM" training for military veterans through our partner National Center for Appropriate Technology
TRACTOR SCHOOL: learn safe use and maintenance of tractors and implements in soil prep, hay making, planting, cultivation, etc.
TOMATO SCHOOL: learn advanced organic tomato production, tomato management from Michael O'Gorman
HYDROPONICS SCHOOL: learn hydroponic strawberry, tomato, and greens production in low-cost high tunnels
SMALL-PLOT INTENSIVE FARMING SCHOOL: learn to grow an intensive garden using fertigation, plastic mulching, and labor-saving methods

HOW WILL YOU LEARN?

You will learn to farm in 12 months
You will receive support and assistance to farm after the 12 month training
GOAL: start a farm after 12 months, start earning money, after 2 years expand your farm

APPRENTICESHIP



Once enrolled, you will become a hands-on apprentice farmer where you will learn high tunnel and in-ground production.
You will also attend other farms to learn new farming methods, attend workshops, and travel to conferences all paid by the project.

STARTING YOUR FARM



After your 12-month training, we will help you start a small farm with the goal to earn money.
We will help you with land access
We will connect you with other new farmers for mutual support
We will connect you with farming mentors who can answer your questions
We will connect you with USDA resources for you to buy your own farm

- **The state of Kentucky and KDVA is in partnership with HBOT4KYVETS, Inc., and the KY medical community testing and treating TBI/PTSD Veterans. Veterans helping Veterans with financial support from the state to receive alternative medical treatment earned and deserved!**
- Veterans may receive 40, 60, or 80 HBOT treatments, one (1) hour per day, 5 days per week, over

2–4 month period. If you're a Kentucky Veteran with diagnosis of TBI, you may qualify.

- The HBO₂ 1.5 ATA protocol for mTBI with post-concussive symptoms with or without PTSD was safe and could be used in multiple centers. The neurocognitive test scores for subjects improved in 21 of 25 measures. (National Brain Injury, Rescue, and Rehabilitation (NBIRR) Study: Jan-Mar 2019).

HBOT4KYVETS, Inc is a 501C3 non-profit which opened HBOT chambers to TBI/PTSD Kentucky Veterans for treatments in 2018 under KRS 217.930-942. I Support Veterans License Plates



Who is eligible

Any owner of a noncommercial motor vehicle required to be registered for use on Kentucky Highways.

Steps Requirement

Application must be made at your local County Clerk's office. Upon receipt of this plate, your regular (special) issue license plate must be turned in or issued to another vehicle.

Decal Expires Customer's Birth Month

\$10.00 of the initial and \$5.00 of the renewal registration fee goes to the Kentucky Department of Veterans' Affairs. For more information, please visit <http://veterans.ky.gov> . This plate is available for personalization with an additional \$25.00 fee annually. Personalization is limited to a maximum of 5 characters.


