Latest VA News

VA names nine additional facilities that will deploy Federal EHR in 2026

Sites are located in Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana and Alaska

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs announced the complete list of additional medical facilities at which it will deploy the Federal Electronic Health Record system in 2026 under its accelerated deployment schedule.

The nine additional VA medical centers and their associated clinics that will go live with the EHR in 2026 are as follows:

- Cincinnati VAMC-Fort Thomas (Fort Thomas, KY)
- Chillicothe VAMC (Chillicothe, OH)
- Cincinnati VAMC (Cincinnati, OH)
- Dayton VAMC (Dayton, OH)
- Louis Stokes Cleveland VAMC (Cleveland, OH)
- Fort Wayne VAMC (Fort Wayne, IN)
- Marion VAMC (Marion, IN)
- Richard L. Roudebush VAMC (Indianapolis, IN)
- Alaska VA Healthcare System (Anchorage, AK)

The nine sites announced today were chosen following planning sessions among officials from VA's Electronic Health Record Modernization Integration Office, regional and local VA medical leaders, VA clinicians and EHR vendor Oracle Health.

"We are excited to bring Veterans in Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio and Alaska a modern medical record system that will result in improvements to care, coordination and convenience. The Federal EHR is integrated across all VA and Department of Defense components, enabling seamless data exchange while enhancing care, safety and customer service for patients," said VA Secretary Doug Collins.

The Federal EHR system VA will deploy at a total of 13 sites in 2026 is the same electronic health record that is already operated by the Department of Defense, and the system will improve customer service and convenience for both VA and DOD patients. The department previously announced in December 2024 that four VA sites in Michigan — VA Battle Creek Medical Center, VA Detroit Healthcare System, VA Ann Arbor Healthcare System, and VA Saginaw Healthcare System — would go live with the EHR in 2026. Full implementation of the Federal EHR system at every VA facility is expected as early as 2031.

VA is pursuing a market-based approach to site selection for its deployments going forward. This will enable the department to scale up the number of concurrent deployments, while also enabling staff to work as efficiently as possible.

VA will adopt a standard baseline of products, workflows and integrations aligned with subject-matter-expert recommendations. The standardized national baseline will ensure successful Federal EHR implementation, accelerate deployments, simplify decision-making and support future optimizations.

VA marks 100 days of putting Veterans first

VA has launched a host of major reforms to refocus the department on its core mission: providing the best possible care and services to Veterans, families, caregivers and survivors.

Secretary Collins discussed the historic progress VA has made in a <u>new video on X</u> and in this op-ed.

As <u>Secretary Collins said</u>, "One hundred days into the second Trump administration, and VA is no longer content with poor results. Under President Trump's leadership, we have already stripped away many of the costly distractions that were coming between VA beneficiaries and the benefits they have earned. And we're looking to make even more historic reforms to better serve our Veterans."

VA's accomplishments during the first 100 days include:

- Providing Veterans the health care choices they were promised under the MISSION Act
- Opening six new health care clinics around the nation
- Taking thousands of employees off of remote work and <u>bringing them back to the</u>
 <u>office</u>, where they can work as a team to better serve Veterans
- Phasing out <u>treatment for gender dysphoria</u> and directing all savings to helping paralyzed Veterans and amputees
- Processing record numbers of disability claims
- Accelerating the <u>deployment of VA's electronic health record system</u> after the program was nearly dormant for almost two years under the Biden Administration
- Ended DEI at the department, stopping more than \$14 million in wasteful DEI spending
- Redirecting hundreds of millions of dollars from non-mission-critical efforts to health care, benefits and services that directly support VA beneficiaries

Kentucky Veterans Cemetery West and Missing in America Project reclaimed 4 Veterans



Monday April 28th, Kentucky Veterans Cemetery West, in Hopkinsville, Kentucky had the honor of interring 4 individuals that were discovered unclaimed at Haley-McGinnis Funeral Home & Crematory, in Owensboro, Kentucky by Fred & Claudia Behnke with the Missing in America Project.

- Army Captain George M. McCulloch (06/07/1921 01/11/2003), a World War II
 veteran sat unclaimed for 22 years, 3 months and 17 days. He was 81 years old at
 the time of his death.
- Navy Seaman Apprentice Frank Golfinos Jr. (09/12/1955 03/04/2024), a Vietnam veteran who served on the USS Stein, sat unclaimed for 1 year, 1 month, and 24 days. He was 68 years old at the time of his death.
- Army Private Richard Albert Sherk (06/12/1950 10/12/2018), a Vietnam era veteran, sat unclaimed for 6 years, 6 months and 17 days. He was 68 years old at the time of his death.
- Tameka Schroader Newton (05/24/1961 08/03/2020), the spouse of Navy Cryptologic Technician Second Class Roger Paul Newton (deceased, location unknown), who served with the US Naval Security Group, sat unclaimed for 3 years, 8 months and 5 days. She was 59 years old at the time of her death.

Patriot Guard Riders of Kentucky, as well as various groups from Kentucky and Tennessee escorted the hearse carrying these veterans and dependent to the committal shelter at Kentucky Veterans Cemetery West. They then lined the sidewalks with American flags as they were escorted by military personnel to the service under the shelter.

These 4 individuals were honored by having custom wooden urns made for them by students of the Henderson County High School Career & Technical Education Unit Carpentry Class. They each had a custom brass nameplate, and emblem identifying their respective branches of service, with an American flag representing the dependent.

The service included guest speakers, KDVA Commissioner, LTC (RET) Whitney P. Allen Jr., State Representative J.T. Payne, & Army Chaplin CPT Donald Howard, alongside Fred Behnke, of the Missing in America Project, and Kim Ebeling, Kentucky Veterans Cemetery West Manager. The 101st Airbourne Division honored these individuals with full military honors, as well as a live bugler, SSG Jeremy Rhoades, from the 101st Airbourne Band.

The 101st Airborne Division, along with Active-Duty Navy Chiefs, honored these veterans by completing flag folds. Accepting the flags, with no family present, Funeral Director Kamryn Losgsdon, of Haley-McGinnis Funeral, Henderson County High School Army Instructor SGT (RET) Ashley Wolfe, J.T. Payne, State Representative, & Tony Rutledge Henderson County High School Carpentry Instructor.

Ruth Simmons Red Carpet Ceremony



The Carl M. Brashear Veterans Center's staff and residents welcomed their newest member to their family, Navy veteran Ruth Simmons, in a Red Carpet Ceremony on April 8, 2025, in Radcliff, KY. Ms. Simmons is 101 years of age and was a member of the Navy's Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service (WAVES). During World War II,

the United States Navy established the WAVES to free up male personnel for sea duty, with approximately 100,000 women serving in a variety of roles.

Simmons is from Georgetown, Illinois. She worked in a printing plant that printed photographs then worked for one year in a plant in Detroit that manufactured parts for airplanes during World War II. Joined the Navy as part of WAVES during the war for 15 months and went to San Diego, California where she met her husband who also served and married at the age of 20. She worked at Andrews Air Force Base and stopped to raise her 3 children. Went on to Langley AFB in 1960 and worked for 26 years and retired as a secretary.

I Support Veterans License Plates



Who is eligible

Any owner of a noncommercial motor vehicle required to be registered for use on Kentucky Highways.

Steps Requirement

Application must be made at your local County Clerk's office. Upon receipt of this plate, your regular (special) issue license plate must be turned in or issued to another vehicle.

Decal Expires Customer's Birth Month

\$10.00 of the initial and \$5.00 of the renewal registration fee goes to the Kentucky Department of Veterans' Affairs. For more information, please visit http://veterans.ky.gov. This plate is available for personalization with an additional \$25.00 fee annually. Personalization is limited to a maximum of 5 characters.
